

Champagne, Leather & Lace set for March 9

YWCA Regina is hosting Champagne, Leather & Lace, an event in support of the new Centre for Women and Families, on Saturday March 9.

The event brings world-class fashion to Regina through a unique runway event conceptualized by Nadia Williamson, owner of NWL and NWL Los Angeles. The event will include actress Amy Matysio as the emcee.

Born and raised in Regina, Matysio served as host of the previous Champagne shows as well as SK Fashion Week and the Mayor's Business & Arts Awards.

In partnership with NWL and The Style Academy, the event will be hosted in the show room of Mercedes-Benz of Regina. The program will run from 6:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m.

The event aims to aid YWCA Regina by bringing them closer to their fundraising goal of \$70 million.

"We've been really fortunate to have the support of some really incredible individuals and companies in Regina, as well as all levels of government, and have raised over \$60 million our community," said Chelsey Lemke, Senior Director of Development for YWCA Regina. "Our build is scheduled to be completed this fall and we still have \$10 million to raise, so this event and the awareness it will bring to our new Centre is really incredible.

The new centre will operate as a hub model, providing wraparound services in hopes of preventing homelessness and other crisis situations instead of just reacting to them.

The 85,000-square-foot facility will offer wraparound care through a trauma-informed approach to provide crisis and preventative supports through the YWCA Regina and community-based organizations and "visiting practitioners" in hopes of addressing barriers that keep vulnerable women and children in homelessness and violent situations
