



Road Report details now available through the waze app

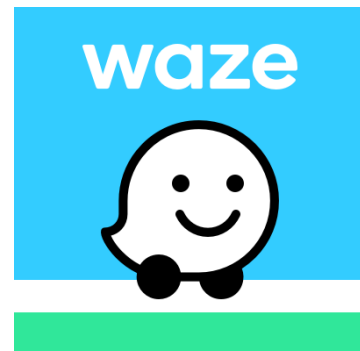
Starting today, the City of Regina is offering more options for drivers to access traffic restrictions and is upgrading the Road Report to be more interactive and provide drivers with additional information to help them get around Regina.

Through a partnership with [Waze](#), the City will integrate important road closures and restrictions directly into Waze, which populates closures onto Google Maps, allowing drivers to access this information from both popular navigation apps.

These apps will offer routes to help drivers avoid road closures, improving the commute for residents and visitors during Regina's construction season.

The Road Report map at [Regina.ca/roads](#) will also see other improvements, including a built-in search bar for drivers to see construction near their destination and new icons to help residents better distinguish between road closures, lane restrictions and other roadwork.

These improvements to the Road Report will help drivers get where they are going as we improve roadways and infrastructure in our community. Construction projects are progressing throughout the city, including work on multi-year roadway and water projects. Below is the latest construction information on three major improvement projects:



Dewdney Avenue Corridor Revitalization Project

The installation of protective casing pipe at the railway tracks and underground water pipes between Albert Street and Broad Street continues for the Dewdney Avenue Corridor Revitalization Project.

Water Network Expansion Project

The Ring Road on-ramp at Argyle Street remains closed for the Water Network Expansion Project. There continues to be a 60 km/h speed restriction on the southbound lanes of the Ring Road from Argyle Street to Broad Street.

There is also a single lane closure and 60 km/h speed restriction on the Ring Road from McDonald Street to Ross Avenue. Both restrictions are in place to support the installation of the new water supply main.

11th Avenue Revitalization Project

The 11th Avenue Revitalization Project continues with its second year of construction. 11th Avenue between the alley west of Hamilton Street and the alley west of Lorne Street

remain closed to accommodate this work. SaskPower and SaskTel are leading most of the 11th Avenue construction in 2024. More information on their work can be found at saskpower.com/reginadowntown.

City invites feedback on proposed budget

The City of Regina is inviting residents to share their priorities when it comes to investing their municipal tax dollars.

Residents can offer feedback on the proposed 2025-2026 City Budget by participating in the City's pre-budget survey, open from Friday, June 6 to Sunday, June 23, 2024, and available at [Regina.ca/prebudget](https://regina.ca/prebudget).

The survey encourages respondents to share their priorities and expectations, weigh in on the City's financial direction, and offer feedback on how potential investments align with the City's strategic priorities.

The City Budget allocates general operating funds, which support the more than 60 services that the City provides to residents, as well as resources for capital investments and projects across the City.



A summary of resident and stakeholder feedback will be provided to City Council when the proposed budget is released at the beginning of 2025, to further inform Council's decision-making during budget deliberations.

The 2025/26 Budget is Regina's second multi-year budget. The multi-year budgeting approach supports longer-term budget planning to strengthen City programs and advance the City's strategic priorities: economic prosperity, community safety and well-being, environmental sustainability, operational excellence, and creating a vibrant community.

SaskPower program assists commercial customers

SaskPower is currently offering assistance to commercial customers through the Commercial Energy Optimization Program (CEOP).



The program is open all commercial customers in Saskatchewan and provides easy access to technical, analytical, and financial support to develop and implement energy efficient projects.

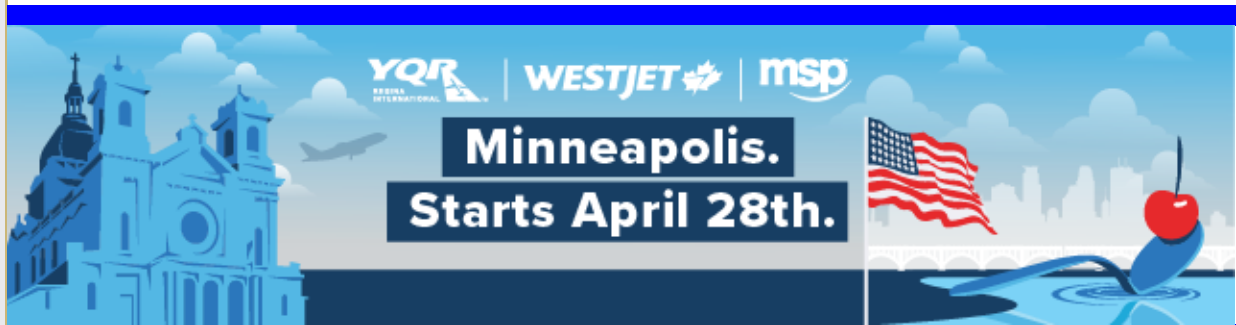
The program offers commercial customers three potential services:

- ENERGY SUPPORT SERVICES – suited to small and medium commercial customers and provides free consulting support on identifying opportunities, business case

development, energy management plans, training and much more.

- ENERGY COACH SERVICES – suited to large commercial customers and provides everything in the Energy Support Services, plus up to \$30,000 annually to hire or retain an energy champion to be coached by an energy professional.
- CUSTOM INCENTIVE SERVICES – suited to all commercial customers and provides financial incentives to implement or retrofit equipment to energy efficient choices. Incentives are based on actual savings achieved at \$0.13 / kWh for non-lighting projects and \$0.06 / kWh for lighting projects, up to 50% of project costs, up to \$100,000.
