The 3rd Annual Global First Nations Carbon Summit, hosted by Carbon RX, will be held on Tuesday, September 24 at the Hotel Saskatchewan.

The summit is a platform for First Nations voices, fostering collaboration, knowledge sharing, and innovative solutions in carbon.

Registration for the event begins at 8:30 a.m. with the program running from 9 a.m. until 3:10 p.m.



The program includes presentations from Marty Seymour, CEO of Carbon RX; Alison Jousti, Principal with ESG Global Solutions; Kallie Wood, President & CEO of National Circle for Indigenous Agriculture & Food; and, Maya Alam, Energy Transition Market Development Leader of GE Vernova.

The schedule also includes the following panel discussions:

- Who is buying carbon credits?
- Using regenerative agriculture as a way to protect and rejuvenate the land.
- A discussion on what makes a strong land use plan.

Refugee Hiring Event slated for November 7

Regina and area employers are invited to participate in the invitation only 2024 Refugee* Hiring Event (RHE) on Thursday, November 7.

Note: Refugee in this context includes any self-identified forcibly displaced past/recent newcomer to Regina and area, who is legally eligible to work in Canada.

This is not your typical hiring event! Organizers will pre-screen job-seeker applicants, matching them with the active job postings from the participating employers. The event, which will run from 8:30 a.m. until 4 p.m., will enable participating employers to interview job-ready candidates that meets the posted hiring criteria.

Interested employers must submit an application by Wednesday, Sept. 25th [here](#). If

selected, the employer will be invited to an

Employer Orientation session in the week of Oct. 21st and provided with the necessary information for event day.



The RHE model was originated by Starbucks Canada, is now administered by the [Refugee Jobs Agenda Roundtable](#), and has proven 13x more effective than traditional job/career fairs, with 50-85% success rates of candidates being hired on the spot or advancing to the next round of the hiring process.

The 2024 Regina Refugee Hiring Event (RHE) is coordinated by [Regina Region Local Immigration Partnership \(RRLIP\)](#) in partnership with our Labour Market Working Group (LMWG) - made up of local employment service providers - [World Education Services \(WES\)](#) and [Jumpstart Refugee Talent](#).
